Sandra Elizabeth Ford is the Special Assistant to the President for Public Health and Science. Her portfolio includes the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the National Institutes of Health (NIH), and the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR).

Before assuming her current position, Dr. Ford held several public health leadership positions in Georgia, most notably as the District Health Director of DeKalb County and Chief Executive Officer of the DeKalb County Board of Health. Dr. Ford also served as the Interim District Health Director for Fulton County in 2019-2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic. Her public health career began in 2003 when she was appointed Florida Department of Health's Deputy State Health Officer/Deputy Secretary for Children's Medical Services.

Dr. Ford is a board-certified pediatrician. She received a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Stanford University, a medical degree from Howard University's College of Medicine, and a master's degree in Business Administration with a focus in Health Services Administration from Howard University's Graduate School of Business. Dr. Ford has held several college faculty positions and her dedication to minority health and health inequities has led to local, national and international media appearances.
